President Dave then introduced Brian Donnelly, our guest speaker, for the day.

Brian took us on a plumbing journey through time.

Brian began with information on the Roman aqueduct system. The system carried 1.2 billion litres of fresh water every day and that worked well for a long time. But in 200 BC someone decided to pipe water using lead (Pb, plumbum) pipes which poisoned much of the population. – Could this be the reason for the decline and fall of the Roman Empire? Though we do not use lead pipes now, our general word for all that has to do with pipes and water, "plumbing," remains.

The first flush toilet (the water closet) was invented in 1596 by Sir John Harrington, godson of Elizabeth I. Though Harrington called his invention Ajax, we now pay homage to him by visiting the "john."

By 1629, Tremont House in Boston offered indoor toilets and free soap for guests.

In 1684, Louis XIV, the Marly Machine pumped water from the Seine to Versailles, about 15 miles.

1775 found the prototype for the modern toilet produced by Alex Cummings which had a water inlet linked to the flushing mechanism and an S-trap. In 1848, the government enacted the National Public Health Act after a significant Cholera outbreak.

Toilet paper (TP) came on the scene as medicated, flat sheets in 1857.

1870 Thomas Twyford introduced the first all-ceramic, free standing, one-piece, washout, pedestal "closet" /flushing toilet. Twyford toilets are still produced today.

In Britain, by 1879, perforated toilet paper on a roll had arrived courtesy of Walter Alcock.

Though Thomas Crapper is often hailed as the inventor of the flush toilet, he came relatively late to the game. However, he did develop the ballcock which improved the tank-filling mechanism and is still used widely in toilets today. Just as with the first toilet inventor, his name remains immortalised with many using either as a euphemism for those not wishing to be blunt.
