Report on Monday 29 September



Shane Casey, Director, Kaiwhakahaere, of ACROSS was introduced by John Freebairn.

Background on Shane Casey

- Grew up in Feilding, attended Feilding High.
- Career includes leadership at Youthline Manawatū and PN City Councillor (2013–2022).

- Stood for Mayor in 2022.
- Recently appointed Director (Kaiwhakahaere) of ACROSS Social Services.
- Personal note: remembered travelling with Stephen Parsons to Gallipoli and Europe to visit family war graves – a profound life experience.



About ACROSS

- Founded: 1990 by Anglican and Catholic parishes.
- Structure: Governed by a skilled board, with a staff of 10 (kaimahi), including social workers, counsellors, and a new clinical lead.
- Funding: \$1.2M, mainly from government contracts (Oranga Tamariki, Ministry of Justice, etc.), plus grants and fundraising.
- Challenge: Demand for services is rising, but funding tight and contracts can suffer cutbacks.

Services Provided

- 1. Social Work & Counselling
 - o Free for the community.
 - o High counselling demand but few counsellors.
 - Support includes sensitive claims and traumarelated counselling.
- 2. Supervised Contact
 - Neutral, safe environment for parents to meet with children.
 - Staff present at all times; play-based setting.
- 3. Bereaved by Suicide Group
 - Fortnightly support group for people who have lost loved ones to suicide.
 - o Reflects NZ's high suicide rates and needs.
- 4. Triple P Parenting Programme
 - o Positive parenting support and education.
 - Helps parents with practical challenges (e.g., routines, child behaviour).
- 5. Strengthening Families
 - Works with other agencies to coordinate wraparound support for families.

- 6. School & Youth Support
 - One-on-one support for tamariki and rangatahi.
 - Focus on belonging, identity, safety, and holistic wellbeing.
- 7. Food Assistance (new partnership)
 - With Rapid Response to provide emergency 24-hour food boxes for families in need.



Current Realities & Challenges

- High demand for counselling and social services.
- Funding uncertainty reliance on government contracts that may be cut.
- ACROSS cannot meet every need.
- Royal Commission of Inquiry ACROSS has historical claims to work through, related to foster care and abuse cases.
- Despite challenges, ACROSS remains a free, accessible service to the community.

In essence, Shane described ACROSS as a trusted, community-based social service provider that has grown from church roots into a professional organisation helping children, families, and individuals in Palmerston North. The work is rewarding but stretched, and future funding stability remains a concern.
